Dr. Catherine Adeya is a result driven information scientist, Governance Specialist, and a Senior Digital Transformation working in technology and development. She has a rich experience across academia, civil society, Government, and the private sector and is a trailblazer in the technology field, a niche sculptured when she joined Moi University among the pioneer class in the School of Information, Communication & Technology in 1988. She is an expert in multilateral agency operations, excellent skills in research and policy development.

Dr. Adeya is the Director of Research at the World Wide Web Foundation, and is responsible for coordinating a global research team dedicated to achieving a web that is safe and empowering for everyone. She has overseen the organization's groundbreaking research in areas from internet access, privacy and data rights, and women's rights online, focused on low- and middle-income countries. Dr. Adeya has extensive knowledge and is widely spoken and published in the ICT for Development sector. She began her career as a Research Fellow at the United Nations University's Institute for New Technologies in Maastricht, The Netherlands. Driven by a commitment to tackle global inequality, she moved back to Africa due to her belief that the web and digital technologies must be used to expand opportunities and drive development. She has served as the Director of Business Process Outsourcing at the Ministry of ICT in Kenya; and as founder and CEO of the Konza Technopolis Development Authority.

Dr. Adeya has been immensely instrumental in the development of the East Africa Centre for Internet Governance and Policy (CIGAP) at the renowned Strathmore University in Nairobi. She was an independent non-executive director at Standard Chartered Bank Kenya and Old Mutual East Africa Holdings. She is also the former Non-Executive Chairperson of Kenya Accreditation Service (KENAS) as well as Senior Representative East Africa's Fieldstone Africa International.

Her biggest dream is to empower as many women as possible to follow in her steps to pursue Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics, popular as STEM subjects, and be part of the process as far as research is concerned.

Dr. Catherine, or Nyaki as those close to her call her, holds a Bachelor of Science degree in information sciences from Moi University as well as a masters degree from the Yale School of Management and a Ph.D. in Information and Development from Edinburgh Napier University.

Dr. Catherine is in the Management of the MU88 Group, a distinguished and outstanding Alumni class that graduated in 1992 and are the pioneers of the adopt a student programme, and the powerhouse behind the MU88 arboretum.
